


Hospital Operating Profit Margin in the Finger Lakes Region








In the Finger Lakes Region, hospitals charge over **1.5 times** their costs for vaginal deliveries. For appendectomies, they charge over **2 times** their costs.

Consolidation in the market has enabled its hospitals to leverage their market power to command high charges for common procedures.

CMS Quality Ratings for Hospitals in the Finger Lakes Region

Most hospitals receive just 1- or 2-stars on the 5-star federal quality rating system.

Hospitals in the Finger Lakes region have the **worst** safety, readmissions, and timely and effective care ratings across the State.

No hospitals in the region have a 4- or 5-star quality rating.

Hospital Closures in the Finger Lakes Region

The regional market is highly concentrated, with only three health systems across 11 hospitals. The region has experienced two hospital closures since 1997; however, a third of its counties (2 of 6) don't have any staffed hospital beds. The Finger Lakes region is severely underbedded, with the fewest number of beds per 1,000 residents (1.12).
